This fall has seen a return of Studio Group to pre-pandemic numbers. Thanks to Joel Fraser for her efficient handling of studio group. This is encouraging to see so many people out and some newer members also taking advantage of the Findlay Community Studio group sessions. It is a great way to meet other painters, improve your own painting skills and/or give feedback to others.

We currently have an Art Show running at Craig Gallery called "Random Works". There has been good attendance for this show and some very favorable comments regarding the variety and quality of the paintings. In addition, sale of paintings has been good. Congratulations to all those who have sold paintings. There is a new curator at the Craig Gallery, Kahn Yuan, who was most helpful in setting up the show. As always, kudos to Kathy Snell for doing a wonderful job of managing the shows. Kathy, Joel Fraser and Paul Edmonds did a marvelous job of hanging the show.

On the workshop side, we are pleased that following the interruptions from Covid, Violet O'Connell is now able to book workshops. We have moved the workshops from the Baptist Church on Hastings Drive to the Findlay Centre. The reason for this move is that the Findlay Centre rent is roughly a third of what we were paying at the church. Our first workshop starts on October 29th and the visiting artist is one of our own DVAS members, Ashley Ritter. Ashley is an accomplished artist and she will be conducting the workshop in pastels. I would encourage members to register for this workshop as it is in a medium that we have not been exposed to before. More information will be sent out on upcoming workshops by Violet O'Connell. Feedback from members at the AGM indicated that the workshops are an important part of our offering to DVAS members. Thank you, Violet for managing these workshops.

This summer saw many members doing ad hoc plein air gatherings arranged by Janet Warnes. The members appreciated having someone championing these plein air outings. Thank you, Janet for your initiative in taking this on.

Looking forward, we need to get more members involved with the executive. Some executive members have been in their positions for a long time and need a break. We are currently looking for a replacement for Sheila Taylor – Communications Chair and for Janice Webber – Membership Chair. The Winter Studio Group Session will begin on January 5th 2023 and run for 12 weeks ending on March 30th. Cost will be \$36.


Exhibitions

"Everybody loves policy!

So here, for your policy-reading entertainment, is freshly created policy regarding our new website. Do please enjoy. Feel free to keep this information in your DVAS files for future reference. In this life, you never know when you might need to refer to some policy or other. Here goes!

From time to time, I will put out a call to DVAS members for images to be posted on our website. I have no set schedule for this, but an upcoming gallery show is a good time to solicit images for (1) the show poster, and (2) the website. The aim is to the keep the website fresh and interesting, with new content being added roughly twice a year.



Note that any and all images submitted for possible use in a show poster, will also be considered for publication on the website. Sending images to me, the webmaster, automatically implies your consent for publication on the website. I look for content from a wide variety of DVAS members, with a wide variety of subject matter and painting styles, to show off the range of interests and abilities of DVAS artists.

Images must be of good quality. This means: sharply focused, well lit, evenly illuminated, not photographed under glass, and cropped so not matting, frame, or background appear in the image. The webmaster will not edit your images It is the artist's job, to edit, crop, and otherwise prepare the images so they will appear online as you wish them to appear. Images should be at least 500 KB in size.

Finally, as webmaster, I will not maintain an archive of submitted images. Once they are posted to the website, that is where they will "live." The most recently submitted images will be stored temporarily and as new images are posted to the website, some older images will be removed from the website and discarded." A number of studio group members have expressed interest a value finder tool which was brought into session recently. The member has offered to place an order for anyone who is interested.

This value finder is made of a red tinted piece of plexiglass measuring $3^{\circ} \times 4^{\circ} \times 1/8^{\circ}$. It is useful for assisting the determination of relative values, particularly in plein air painting.

These will be ordered from Delta Art in Alberta. The cost is \$1.49 each, plus the cost of shipping.
